Purdue Grand Prix Set for April 21

he Purdue Grand Prix, known as the "Greatest Spectacle in College Racing," is an annual event used to raise money for student scholarships. Through the **Grand Prix Foundation** effort 23 scholarships were awarded last year totaling

The Grand Prix was first run in 1958. At that time, karts were built from scratch and built and powered by lawnmower engines. In 1968, the existing track was built on the Northwest corner of campus at a cost of over \$25,000. The track is carefully modeled after the World Kart Championship in Japan.

The Grand Prix is scored by one of the most advanced computer scoring systems anywhere in the world of

racing. Once again the Purdue Grand Prix Foundation will be testing the autoscoring system. This system allows us to provide up-to-date information to the media, kart crews, and the public.

Last year, the brothers of Phi Delta Theta pulled together to create a winning racing team displaying the vast dedication and effort required to successfully compete in the Purdue Grand Prix race. After much planning and labor, we were able to create a cart that represented not only our appreciation for Purdue University, but also our pride and dedication toward our fraternity. With our driver, Quinn Thalheimer, behind the wheel, the Phi Delta Theta team was virtually unbeatable...
