

To The Moon and Back

After 37 Years, Brother Neil Armstrong Receives His Piece of History

Nearly 37 years after being the first man to walk on the moon, **Neil Armstrong '55** was presented with a piece of the moon rock he brought back to Earth in 1969. The presentation was part of NASA's Ambassadors of Exploration award, created in commemoration of the 35th anniversary of the astronaut's walk on the moon.

Neil accepted the award on April18, 2006 during a small ceremony at the Cincinnati Museum Center.

The award, which includes a piece of the moon rock weighing only about two grams, is presented to recognize the successful efforts of those involved in the Mercury, Gemini and Apollo aeronautical programs. It celebrates John F. Kennedy's 1961 vision to greatly enhance the nation's space program by expanding humankind further into the galaxy.

Making Strides in All Areas: Recruitment, Philanthropy, Academics and Athletics

This year was one of the most successful recruitment classes Indiana Theta has had in some time. Combining fall and spring rush, we were able to bring in 45 new members, which raised our active member total to 130 on the Purdue campus. These numbers make us the 5th largest house on campus.

With our numbers rising, we have been able to make more improvements to the house and participate in more activities on campus. We placed in the top ten of 30 houses in Zeta Tau Alpha's philanthropy, Big Man on Campus, which helps fight breast cancer. It is the largest

philanthropy on the Purdue campus. We also participated in the AGD cup and Hunger Hike.

Indiana Theta has done well in intramural sports this year, placing in the top ten of all houses on campus. We are currently in the playoffs for outdoor soccer, hoping to repeat our title from last year.
