It's All about the Network

Membership in Phi Delt Provides Positive Connections even Decades after Graduation

For **Bob Lowe** '59, his ties with Phi Delta Theta still run deep even after a half of a century. His fraternity affiliation has helped Bob to develop long lasting friendships, a business partner, clients, tennis teammates and uncountable fond memories.

After graduation, Bob worked in the civil engineering field for a while before deciding to enroll in The Indianapolis University School of Law. He passed the bar in 1967 and began splitting his time between working with his father, Louie Lowe, at his firm and his civil engineer work.

Bob only worked with his father for about a year before the elder Lowe passed away, yet he credits his father with being a tremendous influence in his life and cherishes the time they had together. "He led me into the law," says Bob. "I saw how much he loved the law and that was my inspiration."

Later, Bob went on to form a partnership with three other lawyers, one of which was a Phi Delt brother with him in college. Brother **Syd Steele** '61 completed the trio that made up Lowe, Gray and Steele, which focused on construction law and eventually evolved into estate and business succession planning.

Today, Bob is a partner in the Bose McKinney & Evans law firm. "Many of my clients were, and still are today, Phi Delt brothers," adds Bob. He has been in practice for more than 42 years with no desire to slow down, and was recently featured in *Indiana Lawyer*, January 21-February 3, 2009 edition. The article touches upon Bob's Purdue roots: "... Lowe finds himself often representing

many startup companies organized through grants and researching professors at the university."

Bob's father, Louie, was also a Phi Delt at Purdue. In addition to his father's influence, Bob joined a group of his high school buddies during Rush in the late summer of 1955.

His involvement in the fraternity started right away since Bob was able to live in the house during his freshman year. Eventually, he became even more involved through the roles of Social Chairman and Choir Director.

During his fraternity days, Bob acquired the nickname Blowe, a shortened version of his full name, which was inscribed on drinking steins and slide rule cases. He also recalls a memorable experience with Brothers Harry Thompson '59 and Steve Rohr '60 with his Model-A Ford. "Fortunately, we survived that experience," says Bob. He also adds that Brother Larry Fisher '59 was one of his "outstanding roommates."

Bob and Phi Delt Brother Robert L. Bowen '61 serve together as Directors of the Indiana Theta Chapter of Phi Delta Theta Fraternity Educational Fund, Inc. Bob elaborates, "Being active in the Educational Fund has allowed me to stay in touch with Officers and Directors of the Chapter House." Recently, a group of Phi Delts from the 1950s got together and recalled the good times had at 503 State

of networking in our business careers," he reflects.

Bob has a wonderful family with his wife Nancy B. Lowe and three daughters: Shannon Lowe Owens, Stephanie Lowe Sagebiel, and Stacey Lowe Almgren.

Bob first met his wife in high school, and although Nancy attended Wisconsin University, she still enjoyed several occasions and dances at the Phi Delt House.

"The friendships that were developed with the brothers from 1955 through 1959 have been everlasting," says Bob. To those brothers following in his Phi Delt footsteps, he advises them to stay in touch with classmates as well as those who graduated in the years before or after.

Brothers Remember Phi Open Founder Bob Haworth '76 at This Memorial Event


