# A New Chapter, A New Beginning

From possibly the six worst months in our chapter's history, to probably the six best, a "new chapter" of Indiana Theta has begun. After twelve actives were kicked out by National and another 22 left on their own last December, we were left with 15 actives living in the House this fall and another two or three actives living out of the House with no money for rush functions this fall and spring. Bill Green '77 (or as I call him, Ed Elliott, Jr.), called, wrote, harassed and arm-twisted his fellow 1970s graduates to not only raise the money for rush this school year, but also enough to greatly improve the functions that were held. Andy Bosworth '80 volunteered to head up the new Chapter Advisory Board (CAB) and recruited more than enough alumni to fill the board. Many other alumni from various decades, without cajoling, volunteered time and money in order

to implement our plan.



and stools, adding new furniture, and installing a large screen HDTV with Blu-ray DVD player. The Actives pulled their weight by participating in every event with large numbers and with enthusiasm. The result is better than we had planned. Fifteen live-in Actives have recruited 23 pledges for the fall class. Twenty-one new Phikeias were at the house September 24th for the bid acceptance dinner affectionately known as Steak and Cigar Night. Two other freshmen accepted but could not attend. With this new class, we nearly doubled the size of the chapter (28 to 51). I don't believe that at any time in our

history have the Actives recruited more pledges than the number of members living in the House. Until now.

We are ahead of our three-year plan to resurrect the Chapter and repopulate the House. While we have had a great start we must remember that this commitment must continue for the next several years in order for us to complete our goal of repopulating the Phi Lodge.

# Purdue Announces Moratorium on Drinking

On September 24th, citing what they called a campus culture of underage and otherwise dangerous drinking, leaders of Purdue's fraternities, sororities and cooperative houses have declared a drinking moratorium. The indefinite ban by the Interfraternity Council means Purdue's Greeks and students living in co-ops won't be drinking at their facilities or functions, no matter the event's location, said Kyle Pendleton, assistant dean of students and director of fraternity and sorority life. "The end result is a safer and more responsible community," said Nick Kitchell, IFC president. "But also, really, this is the opportunity for the students to step up and hold each other responsible, so the university doesn't have to."

### **Indiana Theta President's Award**

The 2010 Indiana Theta President's Award went to the founders of Alumni-in-Action, **Brad Dickinson '80** and **Andy Bosworth '80**. Brad and Andy started AIA four years ago in order to reconnect with the Chapter and the Actives on campus by spending a weekend with them. They raised money on a Thursday night by an Alumni/Active telethon; do the project and land-scaping on Friday, ending with a cookout that includes all the Alumni and Active volunteers, and Purdue football on Saturday.

Some, but not all, of the projects include the new mail room, updating the computer room, new landscaping in the rear of the House, painting most of the common areas on the main floor and basement, renovating the Brick Room, and refinishing the wood floors in the TV Room as well as painting the walls, updating the "Phamous Phi Wall," building a new table and stools, buying new TV lounge furniture and installing the large screen HDTV donated by Bob "Haybaler" Haworth's estate.
