A Foundation for the Future of Engineering at Purdue

Bob Bowen '62 Recalls His Phi Delt Days and Shares His Hopes for the Future of the University's Engineering Program

Dr. Robert L. "Bob" Bowen '62 has been very successful in his career as a Civil Engineer, ultimately founding his own firm Bowen Engineering Corporation, but he still counts his years as a Phi Delt among the greatest and happiest in his life.

"I realize now that my four years at Purdue and as a Phi Delt were the greatest of my life but at the time I didn't know it," Bob said.

But he knows it today and the University knows too. Thanks to Bob's financial funding, the Robert L. and Terry L. Bowen High-Scale Performance Civil Engineering Laboratory was dedicated in 2002. The lab is an \$11 million research facility which allows engineers to test structures like bridges and buildings while focusing on making construction materials more durable, safe, and earthquake resistant.

"You spend all your life building an organization, and this is such a great way to put your estate to great use," Bob said in a 2002 edition of *The Exponent*. "Some of the nation's best engineers and students can be found at Purdue. They deserve to work in a facility that matches their talents."

Engineering wasn't the only focus in Bob's life as an undergraduate. He was a very involved Phi Delt and has great memories of his experiences living in the house.

"It was a great house with great brothers," Bob said. "I feel very lucky to have been a part of it. It was a great atmosphere and my brothers were very cool".

Some of Bob's favorite brothers and best friends from the group are still active friendships and important relationships, both personally and professionally.

For example, Bob had the distinction of fixing up Jim Wurster '59 with his current wife. Bob and Jim were great friends at Purdue and have since gone on to work often together. Jim has an engineering firm which Bob has enlisted many times in his construction projects. The two regularly play golf together as well.

"Jim was like an icon to me, as was **Bob Lowe** '59, when I was an active brother" Bob recalled, "When we were at Purdue, we were civil engineering students. It's great now to be

able to keep in touch with and work with both of them."

Bob Lowe is now Bob Bowen's lawyer. The two see each other frequently.

Bob thinks that the secret to the power of Phi Delta Theta in the lives of Purdue students is in the great brothers and the social group overall.

"When you join a fraternity, you shrink the size of a University," Bob said. "So, if Purdue had 45,000 students when I was a student, you effectively take your social group from tens of thousands of people down to a manageable 80 people. Those are the guys you deal with on a daily basis. You live with them, work with them, share a house, get dating advice, and basically share lives."

Having served as Social Chairman, Bob has a great many memories of his time living at the Phi Delt house.

"I was in charge of the parties after football games," Bob said, "And those parties were not to be missed!"

He recalled that we had our annual dance and Bob put together a dance band for the party featuring his musical talents and those of some friends on campus.

"I played the saxophone and I knew some other musicians on campus, so we just put something together. We didn't really have a band name or anything," Bob mused. "We played big band stuff like Glen Miller and Stan Kenton, which was popular music at the time. It was a great experience for me."

Some of Bob's fondest memories of Phi Delta Theta include normal day-to-day routines at the house playing bridge with the brothers, eating meals together, and bringing dates to the house. He also recalls the house mother and cook.

"They made us get a house mother," Bob explained. "I guess we weren't too tidy on our own. Mother Miller was liked by a great majority of the brothers. Poor woman, we probably drove her insane!"

"We also had a cook named "Daddy-O." He had a restaurant business across town

and took care of the cooking of meals for the house."

"I was a big eater back then," commented Bob. "Some people made cracks about the food, but I always thought it was pretty good."

When asked if he had advice for active brothers, Bob said it was a matter of expectations.

"Raise your expectations. Expect to be the best. Raise your standards and expect to win," Bob instructed. "The chapter has had some challenges – but if they remember to keep high objectives and keep the values of Phi Delta Theta, they'll pull through even stronger than before."

Bob is glad to keep in close contact with the current chapter as well as alumni brothers. Last year he taught Construction Engineering at Purdue and will do so again next fall. He is also an officer in the alumni chapter and on the board for the fraternity's Educational Foundation. Bob is working with the Phi Delts to found a Hall of Fame for notable brothers.

Two years ago Bob was able to attend the alumni golf outing with his Phi Delt brothers. The outing is the largest of its kind among all the fraternities at Purdue. It had 140 attendees and Bob had the distinction of being the oldest alum, though he was nearly matched by his friend and brother **Bill Edmundson** '64 who hit the links with Bob.

Investing in the Future of Indiana Theta

At the initial meeting of the Chapter Advisory Board (CAB) last April, it was decided that the priorities for the chapter are:

- 1. Rebuild membership with quality individuals
- 2. Improve the house to make it more appealing to the membership and alumni
- 3. Build strong relationships with the university, alumni and general headquarters.

Through the efforts of the current actives and alumni, the fall semester was concluded having achieved a lot of progress to those ends. At this juncture the results can be measured easily. We have added 19 fine young men to our fraternity from the fall pledge class and have many promising spring rushees. The house is in the best shape it has been in for a long time with common areas as nice as any fraternity on campus. An energized alumni base has answered the call for help with their time, talent and treasure. General Headquarters have become integral in the

rebuilding of the chapter and are recognized for the great resource they are. It is very clear that everyone is pulling for Indiana Theta to become a leading force at Purdue.

After almost one full year since the formation of the CAB, it is also clear that it will take quite some time and additional effort to get the organization to the level of prominence that all of us would like to see. We need to build on these successes by having alumni serve as examples of leadership and commitment and providing resources to allow the progress to continue.

We raised over \$25,000 this past year that was dedicated to the rebuilding effort. Here is a summary of some of the activities:

- Summer Cleanup

- New furniture in the formal Living Room
- Remodeling of the Pool Room
- · General clean up and painting

At the conclusion of spring rush, we will have consumed almost all of these funds and we will begin more fundraising activities this summer to refill the coffers.
