Ed was Amelia's official escort while she was a professor at Purdue. At a ceremony during the festivities, **Bob Lowe** and his



What valuable life lessons or skills have you learned that you attribute to being a Phi Delta Theta?

I learned several valuable things while at PDT: how to live together with 30-40 other men in one house, that what one person may do can have an impact on others and that working as a group on projects (such as Grand Prix) can achieve better results than going it alone. Living in a fraternity helped me to become more disciplined with regard to time management. Being thrust into an environment where there was the opportunity for a constant party and entertainment, one had to decide when to play and when to study.

In the spirit of recruitment, share a story from your own experience from joining Phi Delta Theta and some advice for a new member this fall.

As a freshman, fraternity rush was a big deal in the late 60s and early 70s at Purdue since the social aspects of conservative Purdue meant that the Greek organizations could provide access to a much better social life. 
