Bob Holloway, 91, of Middletown, Ky., passed away peacefully at home on May 20th, 2016 surrounded by his family.





Bob was the first to be inducted into our chapter's Pillar Society along with **Ed Elliott**.

Bob joined the Navy the day after he graduated from Jeffersontown High School and served aboard the USS Zane in the Pacific theatre for the remaining 18 months of WWII.

A Purdue University graduate, Bob met his future wife, Doris while registering for classes. He was the sports editor for the Purdue Exponent, active in intramural sports and Phi Delta Theta fraternity. He remained an avid Boilermaker sports enthusiast his entire life, recruiting 35 Purdue athletes from the Louisville area. A self-employed, small business owner, Bob devoted many working hours at Middletown Manor, Hi Li and Jeffersontown Swim Clubs and operated a small motel. He enjoyed many things, most especially his alma mater, Purdue University where he served on the Athletic Board and as President of the Purdue Alumni Association.

Bob was also involved with Lindsey Wilson College where he served on the Board of Trustees for 20 years.

Gary Batesole had this to say, "I saw Bob on what was to be his last visit to the Purdue Campus. It was the last home game at Mackey for the Men's basketball season. We just happened to have seats down the row from where Bob was sitting. After he made his usual rounds at the scorer's table he saw me and motioned me to come down to the rail. He shook my hand and would not let go. Bob wanted to know how "the boys" were doing at the Phi Delt House. He also wanted to make sure I had received his check for the Neil A. Armstrong Scholarship Fund. He always wanted to know about his Fraternity brothers and stopped by the Phi Lodge once or twice a year. His visits will be missed."

Edwward A. "Ted" Reser, 92, of Lafayette,



was a 50+ year member and Treasurer of the Housing Corporation and also a member of the Pillar Society.

Al "Screwy Lewy" Lewis, 84, of Mequon,




Alumni Support is the Glue That Holds the Chapter Together

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Any Volunteers or Donations Will be Welcome

Our list of summer projects at the Phi Lodge is long. We have finishing work to do in "HP's Head" as well as replacing old stairwell lights with bright, new LED lights. Boy, does that save some money! We will be re-doing the ceiling grid and wall panels in the Dining Room and adding new LED lights and Wi-Fi as well.

We will be experimenting with a new room configuration in what is now room numbers two and three. Since we compete with dorms and apartments and are a dry house, we must stay ahead of the housing game to keep attracting quality students to our fraternity. Rooms two and three will be combined into one suite with a central living area and four individual rack rooms. Students today want privacy in their sleeping area and many dorms and apartments are beginning to offer

similar arrangements. If this arrangement is successful, we will continue the conversion process over the next several years. The cost will be about \$20,000-25,000 per conversion.

Our next Alumni-In-Action project this fall will be to add oak wainscoting similar to the hallways, to the Dining Room. This is the biggest project AIA has attempted and any volunteers who can help will be welcomed. More information on the date and time will be sent out in the near future. This will pretty much finish up the renovation of the Dining Room, including new furniture, as well as the major upgrades to the kitchen equipment. Total cost over three years will be about \$68,000.

We hope to begin upgrading the main stairwell as well as the Foyer, Living Room, Ladies Head, and the new Neil A. Armstrong Formal Room. If all goes well, we will have wood-style flooring throughout, as well as on the stairs. We are currently evaluating products and costs that will look good and last 25 years or more.

Between upgrading the Boiler Room last year, adding the Theater Room a couple of years ago, renovating the kitchen and Dining Room, and re-configuring the private rooms, we will be on course to be spending \$50,000-\$60,000 per year for ten years in order to keep our 104 year Phi Lodge up-to-date and thriving on campus.
