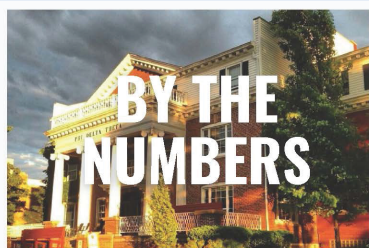

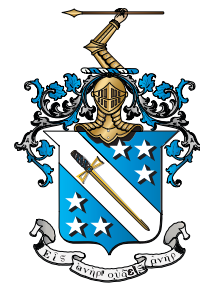

## PRESIDENT'S LETTER

### Indiana Theta During the Year of the COVID!

Dear Brothers:

The Year of the COVID has been challenging, but rewarding. Despite rush being done virtually, as well as the pledge training, the actives have recruited 30 pledges this school year. I still haven't figured out how they did it!

#### Actives in the House

We cut back our summer room renovations because we didn't know how many actives and pledges would be living in the house next fall. It looks like we will only have a slight drop-off and maybe the same number as this year, which is amazing. The chapter had three cases of COVID this semester, but fell below the number that would have forced the house to be locked down for two weeks. We got lucky, and the actives did a good job.

#### Renovations

This summer we will renovate three rooms, with the last three rooms being renovated in 2022. The schedule is being delayed one year because of COVID. That will complete all the residential room renovations and room furniture upgrades (thank heaven!).

We will be completing the exterior chapter house painting and trim repair project this summer with just the back of the house needing to be finished. One of our three chimneys will also be dismantled during this process. We have three chimneys from the original 1910 construction. This chimney has been leaking water during rain and snowstorms and is not functional. We are tired of repairing room, wall, and ceiling damage, so it's time for the chimney to go. The other two chimneys are functional with one venting our heating boilers and the other one being used by the fireplace in the Formal Room. Every year is a little crazy, but COVID makes this year even more crazy.

## CHAPTER UPDATE



### Top at IFC in New Member GPA and Community Service

We are extremely proud of how our chapter ranked in Purdue's semesterly reports on campuses, GPA, New Member GPA, Community Service Hours, and Philanthropy Dollars. This past fall, we had a GPA of 3.24, which is 9<sup>th</sup> in the IFC, and a new member GPA of 3.52, which is 1<sup>st</sup> place in all of IFC.

We raised \$6,500 for ALS, placing us 5<sup>th</sup> in IFC, and gave 2,257 community service hours, which is the highest on campus by more than 800 hours!



### Spring 2021 Recruitment

Due to the ongoing pandemic, recruitment continues to look different. This semester, we were not allowed to have any potential new members inside the house, or have an in-person bid dinner, during the recruitment process. However, we were allowed to have small in-person events at Purdue facilities, as long as the Purdue Greek communities COVID positivity rate was less than 2%. Despite all of these restrictions and another primarily virtual recruitment cycle, we were still able to get 16 new Phikeia.



### New Benches Grace Back Patio

During finals week last semester and over winter break, new benches were being built on the backside of the house along the back patio. **Drew Whiteaker** and **Jack Phelps** put in lots of work to get these benches designed and built. The benches enclose the area and provide privacy from the traffic of State Street. The benches are currently bare, but as the weather warms up, we plan to have eight different sororities paint different sections of the bench to really bring the area to life.

## YOUR DONATIONS AT WORK

### Kitchen Gets Much-Needed Facelift

Over winter break, we invested some of your donations in a much-needed facelift to our kitchen. It is a commercially rated and inspected kitchen with the ability to feed up to 100 people per meal. We haven't painted it for many years and the ceiling paint was peeling (not good for food flavoring). There are eleven lights, only four of which were working.

We had the ceiling scraped, sanded, and painted with a coat of sealer and two additional coats of paint. The walls were cleaned (no before pictures for your benefit), sealed, and a few coats of paint applied. We replaced all the overhead lights with LED lights and replaced all the lights above the stove. I think Dave the Cook may have to apply a SPF50 sunscreen and wear sunglasses from now on.

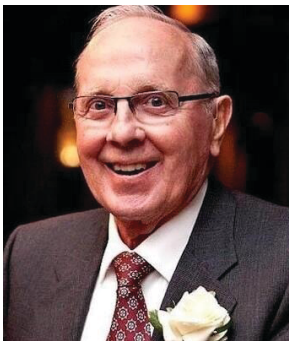
We also had to replace two 3" brass water valves and a 3"

backflow valve system in the boiler room, and replace several light fixtures. Now we can see when the pipes burst and flood the room (don't worry, the two drains still work). After three years and about \$20,000 worth of 3" copper pipe and valve replacements, I think we are good to go for a few more years in the boiler room (fingers crossed).

We are in the planning stages for the final residential room renovations and hope to do four rooms this summer and the final two big end rooms in 2022. That will complete the room renovations for all twenty residential rooms. We're sure there will be more to fix after that! Thank you for your gifts that made this renovation possible!

Since October 5, 1965, Phi Delta Theta has been supplying the U.S. flags that fly over that presidential home. 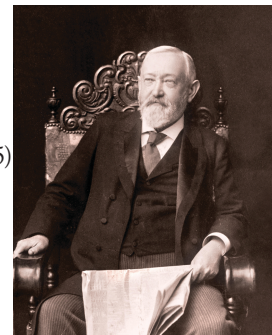

## Phi Delta Theta Purdue Hijinks: Read Your Brothers' Stories And Share Your Own

What were the best nicknames you called your brothers and how did they come about? When's the last time you saw an Indiana Theta Chapter brothers in person? Who were you with, where were you, and what was the occasion? Do you have a photo from that day? What do you remember about the top social event the year you graduated? What was Phi Delta Theta known for during your time at Purdue?

These were some of the questions we asked this spring. Read on to find out how other Indiana Theta Chapter of Phi Delta Theta alumni answered.

**Joe Fuller '57** ([joe.fuller@prodigy.net](mailto:joe.fuller@prodigy.net)) remembers: "When I was a freshman at Purdue in 1953-54, **Neil Armstrong** told me he had never seen the 500 mile race. So I drove us to Indianapolis in May of 1954 and we stayed overnight at my house the night before the race. We then went to the race and drove back to Lafayette that evening. Neither of us knew he would later become the first man to walk on the moon. Life sure has its surprises."

**Bob Bowen '62** ([bob@bowenengineering.com](mailto:bob@bowenengineering.com)) says, "My nickname in the pledge class was "Sh\*t Bird." I think it was because I was the coolest pledge. My lawyer, Bob Lowe, calls me "Dr. Sh\*t Bird Sir."

Bob says that after graduation he went to work for the W. M. Lyles Co, in California, where he traveled the state building waste water treatment plants and also worked on the San Luis Canal in Central California. After that, he started his own company, Bowen Engineering Corporation, which is still in business 54 years later. His son Doug runs the company today, and Bob is back at Purdue, where he's been teaching civil engineering for twelve years.

"Being a Phi was a game changer for me," he says. "I developed self-confidence and made some life-long friends. It shrunk the size of the university and I learned how to live with and get along with some wonderful people. I have done a lot of business with several of my fraternity brothers. We are traveling to the Columbia Gorge in June and Bordeaux in September with my

pledge class."

As for favorite memories, he says, "I remember the comradery, and the two story outhouse for our homecoming display that was rejected by the homecoming judges because it offended their sensibilities. But most of all I remember the leadership that I saw in the house. While I was at Purdue, we won the Grand Prix, and were IFC intramural champs. I was on the house championship volleyball team. My heroes were **Jim Wurster '59**, **Bob Lowe '59**, **Bob Smitson '58** (chapter president), **Syd Steele '61** (chapter president), **Frank Seipker**, **Bob Weist E'62**, **Roger Slusher '61**, **Gary Batesole '77**, and **Mike Sears '61**. I still see all of those guys today, and we are fast friends.

Bob says, "I am on the National Foundation Board of Directors, along with **Jay Ihenfeld '74**, which is quite an honor. Phi Delt has been a huge part of my life. I would not be where I am today had it not been for Phi Delta Theta."

His grandson, **Bryce Bowen**, will be coming to Purdue in the fall of '22. "He is definitely a winner," Bob says. "Ain't life grand!"

**Stephen Cox '69** ([scox2@cox.net](mailto:scox2@cox.net)) says, "Well, everyone seemed to have a nickname in the '60s. Wedge because it is the simplest tool. Wild Bill because he was. Soulman (me) because I liked soul music. Crazy Sam given to him by



the actives. Bubbles was a girlfriend's nickname because of her large 'overhanging chest muscles.' Mad Dog was shared by several."

Looking back at "big social events" while he was at the house, he says, "Avoiding the

draft was a big event in that era."

He adds: "Right before finishing classes in my last semester, I found out my draft lottery number was 96. That insured I would be inducted in the military. Proactively, I immediately contacted the Air Force recruiter. He told me to go get a flight physical at the Air Force base. Right after that I was on my way to pilot training. Now I have completed 50 years of flying. Air Force, American Airlines, and finally private charter jets."

He says that "PDT was known for the First Nighter and parties at Charlie Farmers place, a bonfire event in the countryside. We did a lot of Hairy Buffalo parties where everyone brought a fifth of something and dumped it in a large punch bowl for partaking."

"The Phi brotherhood taught me the value of fraternity and loyalty to the shared brotherhood," he said "The social events we planned and executed will always be remembered."

Stephan recently caught up with **Jack Menaugh '70** on a layover in Naples Fla. in November 2020. "We watched the FB game at his house."

**Pepper Burruss '76** ([pepperburruss@gmail.com](mailto:pepperburruss@gmail.com)) remembers many of his pledge brothers by their nicknames: Nurd, Ruby, Slick, Bear, Budda. "I have no idea how they came about...they likely pledged with them," he says.

Pepper says that while he doesn't remember the top social event of his senior year, he does remember his date — his future wife. "**Mike Beuthin '75** married her older sister and set me up on a blind date with her in 1973."

He says that the house was known as "a bit of an animal house (had the pit out front)" when he was there. He says that during opening week, they would hang a sign "Frosh Women Register Here" that was "intended for little sisters"...but some newbie parents would inevitably walk a daughter up to the front door as they were checking in to campus.

**Marc Mannella '83** ([n584mc@hotmail.com](mailto:n584mc@hotmail.com)) remembers one particular nickname in the

house while he was there. “**Bob ‘Shoes’ Hofmann '83** was as a reference to Jamie ‘Shoes’ Huffman who lost a shoe on the court in his first nationally-televised playing time while playing at Michigan State alongside

Magic Johnson.”

Today, he sees **Bob Hofmann '83** and **Stu Cummings '82** somewhat regularly.

Looking back at his time in the house, he says, “I think we were considered a fun house with a group of great folks. We didn't take ourselves too seriously, but we weren't the Animal House either. We didn't harp on academics, but we had several brothers who were excelling in difficult academic endeavors. There were lots of engineering students. We had big, fun parties and mixed a lot with sororities. We were very visible being located right across from Stewart Center. People got to see the good, the bad and the ugly from a close distance. Thankfully, we were known more for good than bad and we hardly ever got ugly with anyone.”

**Steve Samplinski '92** ([thesamplinskis@aol.com](mailto:thesamplinskis@aol.com)) shared this photo: “This was taken during Spring Break 1991 in
